THE MAJOR GROUP: (Major courses must be numbered 2000 or above)

At least 27 credits (in addition, J1002 is a prerequisite for a required course) in one department or, with the permission of the head of the student's major department, in two related departments (split major). Students must have a grade of 2.0 or better in the 27 credits constituting the major group. Only quality points and credits earned at the University of Connecticut may be used to meet this requirement, save where the dean of the college grants exception.
